



Sunday 5th December – Second Sunday in Advent – John the Baptist

Read: Luke 3:1-6

At Christmas we celebrate the birth of two babies – Jesus, and his cousin John. Before John was born his parents knew he was going to have a special job to do – he was going to prepare the way for Jesus. Today we read about John fulfilling the prophecies about him – he went ahead of Jesus, baptising people, telling them to repent and to ask for forgiveness. John lived in the wild and did all that God asked him to do.

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Sunday 19th December – Fourth Sunday in Advent - Mary and Elizabeth

Read: Luke 1:39 - 56

Mary went to visit her cousin Elizabeth and could not wait to share her news with her. When Mary arrived, Elizabeth was so excited – but something amazing happened – as soon as Mary spoke Elizabeth’s baby kicked – he knew something special was happening. Mary started talking to God and as she was talking her excitement turned to a song and a prayer. This is called the Magnificat and is when Mary explains how good God is and will continue to be. We still say or sing this song in Church today.
